Mr. Ginsburg is president of Intertech Plastics which he founded in 1980 while still in his senior year at the University of Denver. The company is among the top three custom injection molders in Colorado, manufacturing products for the consumer and industrial markets. In 2005, Ginsburg purchased Dennis Green Ltd. a consumer products company that markets and sells a variety of unique products into the mass market in the United States, Europe and Japan. DGL Brands include Ballmania lip balm, Sneaker Ball's, Fresh-T auto air fresheners and Green's Extra Life.

In 2002, he offered to donate half of his work time to serve as president of the DPS Foundation (paid \$1 per year). After hiring a new president of the DPS Foundation in 2003, Ginsburg continued his efforts as a member of the DPS Foundation board.

Ginsburg served as board chair and general campaign chair of the Mile High United Way. He and his wife Leslie sponsored 42 inner city children through the Colorado I Have a Dream Foundation. Their commitment continued through the "dreamers" graduation from high school, spanning a period of 10 years. Ninety percent of the children in the Ginsburg class graduated from high school by the end of 2005. In addition, Ginsburg served as Chairman of the Allied Jewish Federation. He received the Daniel L. Ritchie Award for Ethics in Business in 1998 and the Martin Luther King Social Responsibility Business Award in 1995.
